





Making Golf Fun Again

On April 10th, I had the opportunity to tour our golf course with Larry Gilhuly, an agronomist from the USGA (United States Golf Association). Before his visit, Mr. Gilhuly requested that various Board members send him comments relative to the needs of our golf course.

I will summarize my response to Mr. Gilhuly as follows: Our golf course was constructed over 50 years ago when two factors were prevalent at that time. Number 1: Golf was basically a seasonal game in Oregon, not a year-round sport. Thus, courses back then were constructed without drainage being a priority. Now our golfers desire to play the game of golf throughout the year. Thus, drainage is a real issue on our golf course during our rainy season, notably on hole numbers 2, 12, 17, and 18. We need your advice on how to best address our drainage issues. Number 2: When our course was constructed years ago, golf was primarily a game played by men; thus, our golf course only has separate tee boxes on 4 of the 18 holes. Newer golf courses as you know have as many as 4-5 separate tee boxes on each hole, allowing golfers to play from a distance that suits their game. Lady golfers at our golf course are at a tremendous disadvantage as they must play our golf course from a distance almost equal to that of their male counterparts. Please, Mr. Gilhuly, address this issue.

I was pleased that when Mr. Gilhuly toured our golf course, he addressed both of my concerns in addition to making many other recommendations that when completed will enhance the appearance and playability of our course.

In addition to Mr. Gilhuly making recommendations addressing our drainage issue, I was even more pleased with his comments and recommendations regarding the placement of "new" forward tees. He pointed out that the average female golfer hits a golf ball approximately 75% as far as the average male golfer. Using the 75% factor, the current forward tees now played by our lady golfers of 5,065 yards is equivalent to men golfers playing a course of 6,753 yards. Wow! I don't believe any of us old men duffers would be happy playing a golf course of 6,753 yards when we have difficulty with our current course of 5,398 yards!

Mr. Gilhuly went on to point out that new forward tees should be immediately installed to match comparable distance for both the men and lady golfers. In his subsequent report, he remarked that the goal of forming new forward tees is not to make the course easier or create lower handicaps, but rather to make the course more fun, improve the pace of play, and allow people who love the game to continue to play and enjoy the game of golf later in life.

Since the placement of the new forward tees, I have heard conflicting opinions regarding these new forward tees that are confusing to me. Apparently, some of the lady golfers at our course have stated that they prefer to play the old forward tees. I would surmise that only 10% or less of our lady golfers can reach the greens in regulation from the old forward tees on a regular basis. I would think that golf would be much more fun when greens can be reached in regulation and a golfer is putting for a birdie rather than for a par or worse. Perhaps the lady golfers who prefer the old, much longer distance forward tees are the lower handicap players who are concerned that the new shorter distance forward tees will allow for more parity and competition on the golf course.

Another complaint that I have heard was that the new forward tees are merely placed in the fairway as actual tee boxes are yet to be constructed. My comment to this would be to have patience as in time there will be new tee boxes constructed for the new forward tees. So in the meantime, the lady golfers can enjoy the fact that the new forward tees are placed in a very level lie, enhancing your ability to hit a good tee shot. Many of our current tee boxes are not level and I would rather tee off with a level lie in the fairway than on a tee box that presents an unlevel lie.

In conclusion, I know we continue to lose golfers, both ladies and men, who have given up a game they love as they have aged and can no longer get the distance off the tee that they once did. I know many senior men who would love to play in our Mixed Tournaments if they could find a lady golfing partner. The new forward tees could be an incentive to get golfers back out on the golf course, either playing on Ladies Day Golf or in Mixed Tournaments. The new forward tees are a necessary change that will allow the game to be more inclusive, more fun and less intimating for people to play.

So the purpose of this article is to appeal to the Ladies Golf Club, the Mixed Tournament Committee, the Friday Funnies Group, and the Sundowner Group to immediately allow the ladies to play from the new forward tees as soon as the OGA rating performed on May 10th is received. Let's make golf fun again for everyone!

Behind the Stove

A friend of mine, who grew up in New York City, asked me if I knew what the phrase "behind the stove" meant. She said she often ran into it in her reading and couldn't picture it as she grew up only knowing steam heat.

I told her that my mother cooked on a wood stove all the time we lived in Central Park outside of Aberdeen, Washington. Since my mother always worked, it was up to me (the oldest), to beat it home from elementary school every day, light the wood stove, peel potatoes and have them boiling in the pot by the time mother got home. Once, the flame from the fire flared up and singed my eyebrows. Until they grew back, I was teased by the kids at school as they thought I had been smoking.

The wood stove had to be out a ways from the wall or it might have heated up the wall to the point of ignition. Behind the stove we always had a box of kindling and pitch for starting the fire and anything of size that we wanted to get out of the way. We often had other things behind the stove, like baby chickens in cold weather, cheeping and scrambling around for mash or water in their saucers. Baby kittens and pups would be let into the house during terrible weather until we were sure they were thriving. We even had baby pigs most every year, and if there were a lot of them and we thought they might get lost in the mud in the sty, or that the sow was not taking care of them properly, they also went behind the stove. I remember their squeals. They were a source of great joy to my sisters and me. We loved all baby animals.

The wood stoves, both in our houses and at school, were a great place to dry things off in rainy Grays Harbor. Dad would come in from doing chores and put his wet boots near the stove, hang his coat on a hook on the wall in back of the stove and place his wet gloves in the shelf on top of the stove. At school we would come in from walking to school (no buses for us) and hang our coats on the backs of chairs that were placed in a circle around the wood stove in the back of our classroom so that they would be dry by recess or time to go home.

Vial of LIFE

Do you need or want to leave emergency information for your family, caregivers or emergency personnel? The Vial of LIFE is a simple, but easy way. A tube or packet is provided or you may pick out a container of your own if it is identified well - the notice is usually posted on your refrigerator door.



Vial of LIFE stands for Lifesaving Information for Emergencies. The sticker is

usually red with a red cross. This program is used to provide the patient's medical information when a patient is not able to speak or remember this information.

You may supply contact information or any other information that you feel is relevant to share such as the name of your doctor, your medication list, or known allergies. It is suggested to include pictures of family members, including your pet(s), to help identify each member.

Our pets are a part of our families, and we worry about what may happen when we are ill. In your kit you need to provide name, breed of cat or dog, age and who to call. You may want to leave information on where to leave the pet (example – back room) where is food and water, medications and the veterinarian's name and phone number.

You may want to add a cat or dog notice at your front door on the window or door so that the emergency crew knows when they step into your home. You do not need to worry that your pet was let out of the house. It can be as simple as "dog and cat inside".




