

The items were delivered to the OGA Junior Golf Program, taught by Robyn Lorraine and Tyler Morse.

A full truckload of items was delivered. Some of the items were: full sets of clubs, including 16 sets with bags, numerous single clubs; shoes and clothing, including jackets, shirts and vests; a travel bag, head covers and golf balls. There were also several 2-gallon size bags of tees and ball markers.

Juniors may be enrolled in various golfing activities with encouragement from functions planned for their age groups and with the help of volunteers and organizations committed to the enjoyment and teaching of golf. Woodburn Estates & Golf proudly hosts the Erling Jacobsen Tour, one of the non-compete events every year, providing a place to play with snacks and prizes for the players, at no cost.

For the last few years, members have been donating goods which were delivered annually by Jim Worley to the First Tee Program located locally in Gladstone, Oregon. 
Golf Is Sometimes a Frustrating Game

10:00 a.m. President Becky Butts called the meeting to order and requested that all in attendance please stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and silence their cell phones. President Butts welcomed everyone to the Annual Members meeting. This Board and our general manager have worked very hard for the community this past year, so they will be reading their annual reports to update the members on their endeavors. Thank you directors and your committees for all the hours spent in working for the betterment of this community. I also want to thank you, the members, for letting us serve you. Our goal is to keep Woodburn Estates & Golf an affordable place for middle class Americans to retire and have fun.

Establish a quorum: Board members present Becky Butts, Malena Turner, Stan Hiller, Jim Worley, Larry Jones, Allan Lindberg, Paula Kilgore, Nancy Dale and Jim Taylor. Per Secretary Malena Turner there was a quorum.

TREASURER'S REPORT: These balances were reported at the regular board of October 25, 2016. The accounts were reconciled with bank statements and Balance Sheet provided by Woodburn Estates & Golf bookkeeper as of September 30, 2016.

Our Operating Account balance was \$744,744.84.

Our Reserve Account balance was \$812,957.96.

Our Accounts Receivable balance was \$53,236.05

Delinquent accounts as of October 21, 2016: 39 delinquent accounts totaling \$22,287.18.

7 delinquent accounts with owed balances totaling \$18,614.59 have been turned over to the attorney for collection.

There are 5 homes in Foreclosure or are Bank-owned that have an outstanding balance totaling \$ 5,650.37.

Earlier this year we purchased the Reserve Analyst Software. This is the same software Schwindt and Dan Huntly have used to prepare our 30-year studies in past years. Our asset identification numbering method, along with research of



actual service dates and costs are being updated or input. When completed it will enable us and future boards to better manage our assets.

Proposal Letters to nine different State of Oregon Certified Public Accounts were mailed out and two responded in writing. Interviews were conducted and Johnson Glaze & Co. of Salem was selected to conduct our 2016 Audit and prepare the Corporation taxes returns.

We, the board, passed a motion to increase the working capital fee buyers pay when purchasing a home from \$2,000 to \$3,000 to provide this board and boards in the future sufficient reserve funds to maintain our assets without having to pass on special assessments.

Each board member was presented with the proposed 2017 Operating and Reserve budgets prepared by GM Tom and our bookkeeper Julia Senter. The budget committee met and reviewed each item line by line. I will be making a motion at the next regular November board meeting for approval. Should the board accept the operating and reserve budget as proposed I am pleased to announce that there will be no increases in annual assessments or increases in user fees for 2017.

I want to thank the budget committee members for their hard work. If you are present, please stand when I call your name: Joan Foster, Karen Davis, Fred Bourne, Cliff Latimer, our bookkeeper Julia Senter and our GM Tom Staskiewicz.

Activities-Malena Turner: Activities Committee has had the privilege of putting together events for the Woodburn Estates membership. Here is a recap of our events in 2016, thus far:

- April: Spring Pancake Breakfast. Open to the Public. Sponsors: McCully Realty and Legacy Financial. \$1,500 was donated from the proceeds to Woodburn Police Department to buy a new traffic monitor.

Coffee Hour is going strong. We want to Thank Connie Lum and her committee, who turned the event over to Activities in March of this year. They did an excellent job during their tenure. Sharyn Cornett is now the coordinator for Coffee Hour and has added some great talents to the Hour. Also added is a Resource table in the back of the room for events that people may enjoy throughout the community

We have had to re-instate the dollar charge to the members to help keep the Coffee Hour going. We were not getting the Sponsors we had hoped to get so people would not have to pay, however this dollar helps pay for the entertainment as well as the donuts and coffee that is provided.

This is a list that the Activities monies has paid for. (1) New covers for the pool room tables, (2) Christy Barsky to give pool lessons, (3) new audio-visual screen in dining hall, (4) new TV screens and supports for WII bowling. We are working on ideas to help with upgrading other items at Woodburn Estates.

Activities funds at this moment: \$16,125.59; Coffee Hour funds: \$2,199.06.

We thank all the Volunteers that are and have worked at the events. If there is anyone who wants to volunteer for an event, please call me or leave a note in my box in the office. If there is anyone who wants to sit in on an Activities meeting, you are more than welcome. We meet the 1st Thursday of the month in the Conference Room. We thank you for all you do.

Architectural-Director James Taylor: Once again, I must start by thanking my committee members; Don Robarge and Dennis Durst, for their hard work this past year. As volunteers, the hours they spend and the miles they travel is at their own expense, and, I'm sure that most of you have noticed that they also volunteer in other activities as well. Again, thank you, Don and Dennis.

As of Monday morning, November 7th, we have had 251 Architectural Requests and 169 Compliance requests. This is an increase in both categories from 2015.

Most of the Architectural Requests were the usual, including painting, roofing, driveway replacements, fencing or landscape modifications. There have been some City Ordinance changes that affect some of the projects our owners want to complete. As I've indicated in articles in the *News & Views*, fencing requires a city permit. The City of Woodburn is in the process of modifying their rules for fencing of corner lots that will allow some side street fences to be of greater height. Changes have also been made regarding when a city permit might be required for roofing or window modifications. Our committee can help ensure that you don't end up cross-wise with City Ordinances or our Home Owners Association Rules so don't hesitate to call if you have questions.

I am happy to report that an increasing number of owners are contacting us in advance regarding projects they are contemplating. And, fewer owners appear to be starting projects without prior approval. Both help us ensure that our HOA Rules and Regulations are followed and our neighborhoods are maintained in the manner you desire.

With respect to Compliance Requests, most have found that properties meet current rules or have minor issues that must be addressed. We do frequently find that owners have allowed trees, shrubs for other vegetation to contact structural siding. We've been informed that some lenders will not loan money if siding is not clear, allowing the condition of the siding to be easily seen. At issue is the possibility of hidden dry rot or other structural damage. And hedges are often found to have been allowed to exceed our limit of 7 feet, requiring them to be trimmed. A little work around the house prior to listing a home for sale can help prevent any delays in sale closure.

Golf-Director Paula Kilgore: I have been the Board Director of our Greens Committee since June 2016. My committee members and I have had several items on the agenda.

- We are in the planning stages of changing some golf cart paths for safety reasons.
 - We have been removing diseased and dying trees.
- Tim and his crew have fixed numerous watering issues and have kept the golf course in great condition.
- We raised the tunnel lights and we are now looking into a delay system for the light from Rainier Road under Hwy-214 to the other side with the priority of safety for golf cars on Rainier Road. The concern of the right of way for the traffic on Rainier is a concern for the safety of anyone who uses the tunnel. We need to make sure those owners that drive a regular golf car, know the tunnel is there for their safety, as unless they drive a licensed, street legal golf car, they cannot legally cross Hwy-214 in their cars.
- The House committee and the Greens committee have worked together, along with Tim O'Larey and crew to clean up the maintenance yard, working on fencing and the repair of the maintenance buildings.
- Our next Green's Committee Meeting is Monday, November 14, 2016 at 11 a.m. Gretchen Yoder from OGA will be attending as she will go over concerns of our upcoming course rating in May 2017. There will be a short question and answer session.
- Bob and Sharon Price have stepped down as Mixed Tournament Directors and Len Westphal is the 2017 Mixed Tournament Director. The meeting in August was setting the schedule for the upcoming year. The dates have been submitted to the Board and have been approved. They are listed on the website.

The past six months have been a very busy time for me and a great learning experience. I have had the privilege to work with great team and hope this will continue for the next year. My goal is to keep our golf course in a prime condition, which makes it an asset to all homeowners here at Woodburn Estates & Golf.

House-Director Larry Jones: As this year comes to an end it is time to reflect on what has been done. The House Committee has accomplished a lot thanks to the hard work done by its various members. First, I want to thank Walt VanRheen and Dawn R Cole for their vision and leadership. Thanks also

go to Donald Clark, Martyn Shepard, Gene Stiles, Peggy Rake & Larry Kemper whose contributions in the Committee meetings kept us on task. We remember Al Harris who also served on the committee. Finally, the assistance of Frank Jameson, Becky Butts & Tom Staskiewicz for their advice is much appreciated. Special thanks to the Board of Directors for approving our projects.

We started the year with a new reserve budget and started working on the following projects:

- 1. *Health Center Remodel:* This project started in 2015 was finished in 2016 and many of us are enjoying the updated facility.
- 2. Office Remodel: The original budget for this job was \$80,000. With the efforts of our Maintenance Staff the job came in about \$60,000.00 under budget.
- 3. Window Replacement for the Health Center building: Window replacement was necessary to replace the outdated variety of single and double pane glass windows. A lot of the windows were not shatterproof and were not safe for you the members.
 - 4. Installation of Sound Proof Walls in the Conference Room: Completed.
- 5. The Golf Course Equipment Building in the RV Lot: The House Committee took over the job of building a pole barn to house our golf equipment. With a lot of help from everyone the new building protects our golf maintenance equipment from the Oregon weather. We hope this building will provide years of use for the benefit of Woodburn Estates & Golf.
- 6. *Upgrades for Restrooms in the Auditorium:* We added an ADA Restroom to the north of the stage in the auditorium and are in the process of updating the existing restrooms for the benefit of our members. This later work will be done after the holidays.

8. Replacement of Air Conditioners: I hope we have weathered the perfect storm in regards to our air conditioning and HVAC equipment. This year we had to replace 4 rooftop air conditioners and 2 ground air conditioners in the Auditorium and Dining Hall. All of the rooftop units had been installed in the 80's. Why they all failed in the same year caused me a large loss of sleep. With everything up and running now, I am happy.

Work in Progress:

- 1. Painting of Health Center, Community Center and Cart Storage buildings
- 2. Developing plans to send out for Bids to present to the Board of Directors for the construction of the long awaited Gazebo. It is the hope of the House Committee to have this ready for construction this next year.
 - 3. Installation of the New Windows for the Clubhouse.
- 4. Installation of new gutters & downspouts for the Clubhouse & Health Center.
- 5. Installation of the ADA doors in the Auditorium has been completed and the ADA door will be installed this year for the opening from the office to the health center.
- 6. Woodburn Estates & Golf has contacted Michael Finkelstein Design from Silverton to design our exercise room expansion.

Membership-Director Nancy Dale: We will be having another new membership meeting in January, 2017. I have emailed the Membership Committee to verify their available dates to attend the New Member meeting in January. Pending their responses, I will finalize the date for the gathering.

My tenure on the Board of Directors began in April, 2016. I would like to thank President Becky Butts for appointing me to this position.

I contacted each new Woodburn Estates resident (over 70) by phone to welcome them to our community, and to introduce myself as the Director of Membership. The calls were to those residents that had moved to Woodburn Estates from March to September, 2016. By calling the members, it opened a dialogue for questions as well as making them feel welcome. I had many great conversations with our new neighbors, and most all appreciated the personal

contact. I will be making calls again to those that have moved here since September in preparation for our new member meeting in January.

I had a new membership meeting to welcome our new neighbors on Saturday, September 17 with 39 of our residents in attendance. All board members either gave a talk about their role at Woodburn Estates or were represented by a board affiliate or a committee member. Other speakers included our General Manager, and representatives from Men's and Women's Golf, Yoga, Writing Club, Coffee Hour, Dance Club, Zumba, and Tai Chi.

Those that have moved to Woodburn Estates since 2016 have arrived from over 70 different cities and 12 different states including, Florida, Oklahoma, New York, just to name a few, with the average age being 65.1 years.

Real Estate-Director Nancy Dale: This report is for homes sold as of November 4, 2016. Homes sold year-to-date in 2016: 122. Homes sold year-to-date in 2015: 125. Pending sales is 47 as of November 4, 2016.

Rules & Regulations/CC&R's-Director Jim Worley: 2016 was a busy year for our committee with complaints. We received 78 written complaints by the end of last week from our members, with 12 open right now. One of those is being turned over to the lawyer, and two are being fined. Most of the 12 open complaints are in the process of being corrected, and have moved to "watch only", where the committee checks it once or twice more and then closes the complaint after confirmation that the issue is corrected. Most of the complaints that the committee handles are yard issues.

One of the requirements of my position is to update the documents as motions are made, posted and approved by the board. This applies to the Rules and Regulations, the Bylaws and the Standard Operating Procedures. The documents are posted online on our association website, plus the Bylaws are recorded in Marion County when they are updated. Before the end of 2016 we will update the documents once again, with the motions since the last revision so that the next Rules committee is current.

I want to thank my 2016 committee members, Marie Worley, Diana Lindberg, Bob Trojak, John Thomas and Ron Ewing. As advisors, I appreciate the help and support of our Board President, Becky Butts and General Manager Tom Staskiewicz. It has been my pleasure to work for you the past three years.

RV Lot-Director James Taylor: I assumed responsibility for the RV Lot this year knowing next to nothing about it. As a result, this past year has been an interesting experience. One major project completed this last year was the construction of the storage building for much of our Golf Course maintenance equipment. This building allows us to store, under roof, over \$160,000.00 worth of equipment, protecting it from the elements and potential vandalism. During construction, several members had to move their vehicles in the lot to prevent damage during work or to allow adequate access to the building site. I want to thank those members who so graciously agreed to move their vehicles. We have restored to use several small and medium sized parking spaces now that the building is complete. The next project we will be tackling is an improvement in drainage in the lot. As many of you know, heavy rains or overflow from nearby agricultural fields often leads to standing water in several locations. The Reserve Fund includes money in 2016 for this work. Please remember that the RV Lot gates are currently on winter hours; 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. If you are in the lot after 8:00 p.m., your card key will NOT allow you to exit.

Technology-Director Allan Lindberg: Here is a brief list of items completed this year.

- 1. The Auditorium and Dining Hall sound system upgrades are complete.
- 2. Two ceiling mounted WI-FI enabled projectors have been installed, one in the auditorium and one in the dining hall.
- 3. The large TV in the west lobby has been converted to a Digital Media Display and will display current and upcoming activities and events.
- 4. More Digital Media displays are being considered for our facilities to provide information to members.
- 5. Two high-speed WI-FI routers have been installed with one more slated to be installed above the Pro Shop area. High speed WI-FI coverage will be available throughout the buildings including the Gazebo area.
- 6. WE&G purchased a slightly used HP G8 Network Server for the price of new. The HP G8 will fit our needs through the next five years.

Future projects:

- 1. The phones and phone system have been earmarked for an upgrade in 2017. The system would include individual voice mail boxes for office staff and maintenance.
- 2. Additional card readers are needed within the buildings to control access as we introduce new technology and equipment in our buildings to reduce the chance of items growing feet. Three locations were identified as, the entrances to the auditorium, pool room, and conference room.
- 3. The committee identified and determined our events and activities calendar system to be cumbersome with regards to integration without having to reenter information, which is redundant and opens the door to errors. Discussion to

purchase MS Exchange Server that provides a single calendar and email boxes for each office and maintenance staff.

General Manager Tom Staskiewicz:

- Wrapping Up My First Year: As my first year as your general manager comes to completion I am grateful for the support of the board and the entire Woodburn Estates Community. This was a very busy year as we addressed issues from old contracts, delayed projects and numerous other challenges. We have made great headway but we are not done; I am looking forward to working with the next board as we continue to tackle problems.
- *Professional Services:* During this past year, we have spent time assessing the professional services we have been receiving and found that in some areas we can do better and are making the appropriate changes to work with new service providers.
- *Oregon Trails Program:* In January, we took over the Oregon Trails Program with the intent of increasing the value to members of Woodburn Estates & Golf and the members of the other affiliate courses. Our goal is to increase the number of affiliate courses and provide members access to more golf choices at reduced rates.
- *Improvements:* Our committees have been working feverishly to update facilities, provide more opportunities and activities for our members and reach out to the Woodburn Community to show our commitment to Woodburn. In 2017, we will continue these efforts to make this a showplace 55+ community.
- Woodburn Estates & Golf is a great community and I am very happy to be here working for you!
