

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## MINUTES OF THE WOODBURN ESTATES & GOLF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

October 24, 2017, 1:30 p.m. (Approved November 7, 2017)

**1:30 p.m. President Jim Taylor** called the meeting to order and requested that all in attendance please stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and silence their cell phones. President Taylor welcomed everyone to this meeting.

**Establish a quorum:** Board members present: Jim Taylor, Janice Aiken, Malena Turner, Chuck Johnson, Dawn Cole, Larry Jones, Allan Lindberg and Nancy Dale. Paula Kilgore was absent with notice. Per Secretary Malena Turner there was a quorum.

President Jim Taylor: Welcome to our October Board meeting. On November 14, we will elect three members to the Board of Directors, who will begin their three year term on January 1, 2018. However, Board officers for 2018 are elected in November at our normal meeting on the 28th. Some have asked why the officers are elected so early. The simple answer is to allow a smooth transition of power. A new President, Vice-President, Secretary or Treasurer need to be given time to become fully aware of their new responsibilities. Even if a new officer is one of the current Board members, his or her duties will change. Further, by electing a President in November, he or she will have time before our December Board meeting to determine how to assign responsibility for our various standing committees for the ensuing year.

I would like to thank the Nominating Committee for their work this year. Some have commented that we should have had more candidates. I agree, but it was not for lack of effort on the part of the Committee. They contacted a large number of people to encourage them to vie for a position on the Board. They were routinely told "no" or I'm too busy, or any number of other excuses. If you are indeed unhappy that we don't have more candidates, next time, place your name in nomination. Further, I want to thank the Election Committee for the work they've done already (stuffing and addressing 1,508 envelopes) and for the work they will do on November 14.

**Agenda:** President Jim Taylor then asked if there were any additions or corrections to the agenda.

**TREASURER'S REPORT-Director Chuck Johnson:** The balances reported today were reconciled with bank statements and balance sheets/ledgers provided by the Estates bookkeeper as of September 30, 2017.

Our Operating Account balance as of September 30, 2017, was \$786,170.37. Our Reserve Account balance as of September 30, 2017, was \$876,100.48.

The Accounts Receivable statistics presented today were determined as of October 20, 2017. On this date, the balance of our Accounts Receivable was \$49,987.30, a slight reduction when compared with last month's balance. We currently have 38 delinquent accounts, a reduction of 13 delinquent accounts when compared with last month's report. Our attorneys are currently handling 3 delinquent accounts in an effort to collect money owed to the Association. These 3 delinquent accounts total \$7,117.85. Two properties with delinquent accounts have been foreclosed on and are now bank-owned. The total of these two delinquent accounts is \$6,815.71.

I would like to commend our Office Staff and attorneys for their work in handling delinquent accounts. On February 24, 2017, we had 124 delinquent accounts with an outstanding balance of \$108,426.38. Compare that with today's report wherein we only have 38 delinquent accounts and an outstanding balance of \$49,987.30. By approving reasonable payment plans, the Board has allowed members with hardships to become current with their annual assessment. We have had very few accounts this year that have been written off as uncollectible.

Our 2018 Budget Committee should conclude our efforts tomorrow in the preparation of a draft of the 2018 Operating and Reserve Budgets. I would like to report that our Association is financially solvent and I am pleased with the efforts of our Budget Committee in the preparation of a prudent and realistic budget for 2018. I am asking President Taylor today to call for an Open Board Meeting for Tuesday, November 7, 2017, which will be a Budget Workshop wherein Directors not on the Budget Committee will be provided with a draft of both the 2018 Operating and Reserve Budgets; thus, allowing their input relative to the Budgets.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** None.

**NEW BUSINESS:** 

President Jim Taylor requested a motion to approve the regular minutes for September 26, 2017, it was so moved. Seconded and approved.

**President Jim Taylor** requested a motion to approve the special minutes for October 5, 2017, it was so moved. Seconded and approved.

**Director Chuck Johnson:** I move to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented today in this meeting. Seconded and approved.

**Director Janice Aiken motion #1:** I move that the following change to the Bylaws be posted until our next regular Board meeting on November 28, 2017. Bylaws #4 Members: 4.1-1 Property Owner Members. Allow owners of a lot(s) in Senior Estates, and the owner's spouse, *domestic partner, or co-owner* shall automatically be members of the corporation and are subject to assessment, whether or not they participate in any corporate or club activity. Membership is not transferable and is canceled upon change of lot ownership. Voting rights are suspended if the Property Owner member is not a member in good standing. Motion #1 was seconded and approved to post. (bold italic words are new)

**Director Janice Aiken motion #2:** I move to approve the new Schedule of Fines titled "Board of Director Fine Schedule". Motion #2 was seconded and approved. Discussion: The Rules Committee has voted to move some complaints to the Board because Rules has exhausted their authority to handle them, such as legal issues.

**Director Janice Aiken motion #3:** I move to approve the new Schedule of Fines for the Rules Committee. Motion #3 was seconded and approved. Discussion: The Rules Committee reviewed the current Schedule of Fines along with the new Schedule of Fines and unanimously agreed that a change in fines should be made.

**Director Janice Aiken motion #4** for Paula Kilgore: I move to approve the following Golf Fees.

Owner \$650 with second paying \$500 combined \$1,150

Associate Golf Only \$875.00 with second paying \$600 combined \$1,475

Associates Social with golf single \$1,150 with second additional \$885, combined \$2035

Associate Social Only \$500 with second additional \$385 combined \$885

Mini Social \$200 (this for pool & fitness area, plus if wanted, 1 club such as walking club or Wii bowling)

Twilight Golf Only after 2 p.m., 7 days a week with available tee times

Member \$400 with second \$300 combined \$700

Associate \$625 with second \$480 combined \$1,105

Weekend and Holidays Only plus Mixed Tournaments

Member \$300 with second \$230 combined \$530

Associate \$575 with second \$440 combined \$1,015

Special Limited Golf for Members Only (aka Mini Golf - less than 9-holes)

Member \$150

Discussion: We are finding declining membership in golf as a reason to try some new marketing strategies to promote more participation in these programs. By offering these new fees we hope to add new members in both the homeowner and associate area. The arbitrary number used in the reduction of fees is approximately 23%. The end result being not having to raise the golf fee. Motion #4 was seconded and approved.

**Director Larry Jones motion #1:** I move to approve \$13,000.00 using asset ID #1100 to refinish the hardwood floors in the auditorium. Motion #1 was seconded and approved. Discussion: The House Committee received (3) bids on for the job. It was determined that Willamette Hardwood Floors Inc. bid best assured us that we are getting the work we are paying for. Their bid came in at \$11,400 which was the low bid. The other bids came in for \$12,000 plus and in the \$20,000 range. This work was budgeted for \$30,000 in the 2017 reserve budget. Woodburn Estates and Golf has worked with Willamette Hardwood Floors in the past. The owner, William Daun's father and grandfather have serviced this floor in the past.

**Director Larry Jones motion #2:** I move to approve \$4,800 using asset ID #100100 for the installation of a new fence next to the 17th tee area that will replace the arborvitae trees that are currently there. Discussion: The House Committee has been working with Paula Kilgore, Director and Golf Committee Chair, to remove the existing arborvitae. There are many of the arborvitae that are dead or dying. We can take the healthy trees and replant them in different places around where ever they are needed. We received three bids from local contractors and Rick's Custom Fencing was the Low Bid at \$4,484.34. I have added a contingency amount to the estimate in case something comes up. Motion #2 was seconded and approved.

**Director Larry Jones motion #3:** I move to approve \$35,000 for the installation of new LED lighting in the parking lot. Discussion: We received (3) bids. Cherry City Electric Inc submitted the low bid of \$28,993. I have added a contingency amount to the estimate in case something comes up. The contractor work will furnish and install. Permit included work to existing lights: Install 8 new LED fixtures to 6 existing parking lot poles; remove the existing parking lot fixtures; install 12 LED floods at existing locations; install 3 LED Wall Pack type fixtures at existing locations; install new lights and poles; furnish and install (2) new parking lot poles, each pole to be equipped with (2) new LED fixtures each. This work cannot begin until after the first of the year. We will not have an Asset ID until after the budget is approved. Funds for the work is included in next year's budget.
