Fitness Center 1 Year Anniversary

He will certainly surpass two 25-pound dumbbells soon.
- Post-surgery recovery: We do see many members recovering quickly using our new facility to speed recovery and gain muscle after knee, hip and shoulder surgeries.
- Range of motion: We have seen many members with limited range of motion caused by diseases, lack of use of joints, and many more causes, able to regain some small and large movements. Again...this all adds up to quality of life.
- Increased balance to prevent falls: We have Senior Fitness classes that focus on overall fitness, strength and balance. Simply stated...we do not want to fall!
- Pain relief: This is always a challenging one for doctors and Personal Trainers and we have been able to help many members. Exercise is crucial for managing and reducing pain from conditions like arthritis, as regular movement helps lubricate the joints and decrease stiffness. Plus, exercising can help reduce the risk for heart disease, cognitive impairment, diabetes and stroke.

I could go on and on with the many reasons to visit our Fitness Center and attend our Senior Fitness class. We also have a Senior Fitness class called Sit N Fit. For Anyone Seeking a Notary Public

A few weeks ago, I read an interesting article in the Woodburn Independent newspaper. It was titled "A Helping Hand for Businesses". Knowing that Woodburn is growing by leaps and bounds, I found that a resource center as described in the article could certainly be an asset to our residents. I think our community could benefit greatly by providing Woodburn with this new business resource agency. I would think that one of the resources listed could be Information on a local community notary public.

I found myself needing a notary public, since I have written my own will and testament, and I need to get it notarized. I took my will to my Wells Fargo Bank but they no longer provide a Notary Public service and sent my caregiver and myself on our way. We returned home and searched for a Notary in the telephone book; by cell phone searches; calling friends and family, but we came up empty-handed. We also contacted Law offices, other banks, Chamber of Commerce, Disability/Aging services, Woodburn Police department, Disability Resource office, and other resource agencies. The only notary we came up with was a "mobile notary" who charged \$10 for notarizing a Will plus \$30 for transportation to one's home to sign off. None of these resources could even give us a referral to a Notary Public here in Woodburn. There was a notary listed in Salem, however, it was another mobile notary public who charged \$60 for travel expenses.

I am unable to drive to Salem, nor does my caregiver's agency provide her paid mileage for travel expenses outside of Woodburn. After the many contacts made by myself and my caregiver, frustration had certainly set in. Our seeking further information was futile. I cannot understand why someone can hire an attorney to draw up a Will and also provide notary service but, for those writing up their own, are not able to use their notary. If someone could be of help to me, and others, it would be greatly appreciated.

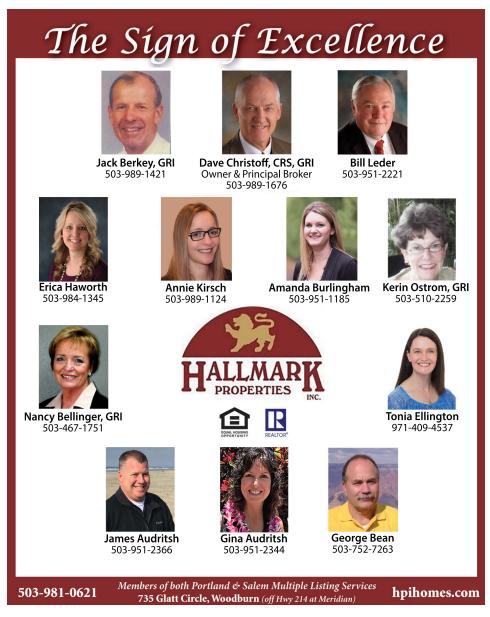

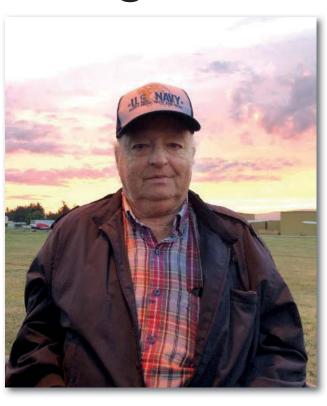

Recently, my heart has been misbehaving. For no apparent reason, at times it races, or beats in an irregular fashion. My family doctor referred me to a specialist who recommended a special specialist. Ignoring my comment, Ms. "Shortie" Circit said, "You should avoid certain practices that could trigger heart irregularities, such as smoking, alcohol, and caffeine.

I replied, "I don't partake in any of those."

Cora spoke up, "Add women to the list."

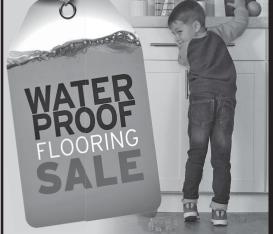

(disappointing Cora) asked me to sign a form granting him permission to operate, and ordered two tests to be performed before the procedure: a heart MRI and a sleep study.

I inquired, "I had a heart MRI recently, revealing excellent heart health. Why do I need another one?"

He replied, "I need one that focuses on heart rhythm."

I reflected, "No big deal," and then asked, "What is the purpose of the sleep study?"

Dr. Courent answered, "Breathing interruptions while sleeping can cause heart defects." I thought, "No more bed pillows."

He added, "Most people stop breathing for a few seconds, hourly, and then start back up again."

I acquiesced, "As far as I know, I don't have that problem, but I'll take the test."

It was Tuesday, of course, always my worst day of the week. I had an appointment at the hospital to pick up the sleep-test monitor and take it home overnight. The rep opened the suitcase and described all the parts that Cora will be strapping onto me. She also stated, "You must return the monitor by 11 a.m. Wednesday or they'll assess at \$750 charge."

I commented, "That should help my sleep."

Later that evening, Cora sorted through the suitcase's contents and found a folder of forms for me to complete:

- 1. Description of last night's sleep experience. I asked the Dish, "I wonder how much detail they require?" She gave me "the look."
- 2. A general questionnaire about sleep practices. "The look" was still in effect, so I said nothing, nothing at all.
- 3. The morning-after form. Once again, suppressing my impulses, I made no comment. It turned out to be little more than a list of how many times I get out of bed to use the bathroom. Cora teased, "More than 3 but less than 7." (My version of "the look," is ineffective.)

Due to my impatience, Cora handled the assembly. She mounted and fastened two straps, one about my chest, the other around my waist, both flaunting electrode connections. She connected the sleep monitor, about the size of three cell phones stacked up, to the chest strap, and then ran wires from the monitor to both the chest and waist straps. In addition, she snaked two wires from the monitor up opposite sides of my neck, coiled one around each ear, and fixed them onto a cannula in each nostril. I wondered, "I'm supposed to sleep hooked up to this contraption?"

Per normal, Cora heard my thoughts and said, "Whine, whine, whine."

I replied, "Wine will help."

Half an hour later, I laid down on my side of Cora's bed and stated, "I'm giving this 10 minutes. Tops." The next thing I remembered was a 3:40 a.m. bathroom visit; and then waking up at 6:30 a.m. I said to myself, because the Dish chose to sleep in another bedroom in case I whined all night, "That's the best night's sleep I've had in a month! Perhaps Medicare will pay for a couple more nights."

I returned the machine on time, no charge, and a week later heard from the sleep clinic, via letter: "You had 7 breath interruptions per hour, 5 is average. The sleep doctor will put in a prescription for a CPAP (continuous positive airway pressure) machine."

I mumbled, and yes, Cora heard me, "This isn't right. The Dish causes at least 2 of those interruptions per hour, reclaiming her covers."

Cora said, "Whine, whine, whine."

I suggested, "When you get cold in bed, just come on over to my side."

She replied, "That's where all my covers are.

I defended, "A guy's gotta do what a guy's gotta do."

Not soon thereafter. I received a second letter from the sleep clinic that stated. "You will hear from the sleep clinic within 10 business days to schedule an appointment to pick up a CPAP machine."

I inquired about a month later, and within a week, received a phone message, informing that I can pick up the CPAP equipment next Tuesday.

We met with the respiratory specialist, listened to the CPAP instructions video, and once again proceeded home with a suitcase. All by myself, I donned the equipment: multifaceted head-straps, attached to a combination nose and mouth cover, attached to a 4ft. long, 1-1/2 inch diameter, elastic hose attached to the machine that I'd set upon my bedside stand.

I mentioned to Cora, "This gizmo will make it difficult to make out...but not impossible."

She gave me "the look."

I asked, "What happens if I have to get up to use the bathroom?"

Cora replied, "If? Just disconnect your hose."

I asked...shakily, "You mean the machine hose, right?"

She gave me "the look" and said, "Shut it. Just detach the hose right here at the nose and mouth mask."

I mumbled, "I'm still uncomfortable about wearing all of this head gear. I'll try it tonight, and we'll see how we make out."

Yes, Yes, she did.

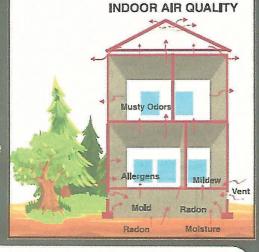
