## Did You Know?

A Note From the Rules Committee about Golf Course Rules and Etiquette

It was noted at the last tournament on June 14, 2014, that riders/drivers that were not playing in the tournament were out on the greens and fairways with the players. This is against golf tournament rules. Also against the rules is giving advice to a player if you are not a member of the team. Reminder: Dogs are NOT allowed on the golf course at any time.

Rules \& Regulations (revised January 24, 2012)
14.1 The Golf Professional is responsible for directing the priority of play on the golf course.
14.2 Members and guests must register at the Pro shop before golfing. The guests name, address and date of visit must be recorded and a valid guest tag will be provided for view on the bag.
14.3 Members who elect not to pay annual golf fees may pay green fees with no limit on the number of rounds each year.
14.4 New golf members must receive a briefing on the rules of golf, golf etiquette and the local rules by the Golf Professional or pro shop assistant before receiving their playing privileges.
14.5 Golfers must have their own golf bag and a set of golf clubs.
14.6 Golf may not start on the golf course before 7 A.M. except for scheduled tournaments that require earlier tee times.
14.7 Play of nine holes should be completed in one hour and forty-five minutes; play of eighteen holes should be completed in three hours and thirty minutes.
14.8 Practice is not permitted on
the golf course.
14.9 Players coming from the \#9-hole will have preference onto \#10-tee. Golfers stopping between nines for refreshments, except for items to be carried and consumed enroute lose their preference.
14.10 Golfers who fail to keep pace on the course and lose more than one clear hole on the golfers in front must invite the golfers following to play through.
14.11 It is requested that you carry sand/seed mixture on your golf car or pull cart when playing golf.
14.12 Divots on the tee boxes are not to be replaced; they are to be reseeded with the sand/seed mixture provided at each tee box.
14.13 Sand trap rakes are to be left in the sand trap in a position to cause the least interference to following golfers and the green mowers.
14.14 Members and guests must start at the first tee or the tenth tee. Members only may start at other tees with permission from the Golf Professional or pro shop assistant.
14.15 Members who start on holes other than one or ten must let following golfers play through.
14.16 Golfers will show their membership card, bag tag or receipt for green fees upon request of the Golf Professional or authorized personnel. If such proof is not provided, the offender will be reported to the Golf Professional or pro shop assistant.
14.17 More than four persons are not allowed to play as a group except as sanctioned by the Golf Professional.
14.18 Children must be 10 years of age to play golf, unless they are able to show proof of handicap from a golf association. They must

14.19 Members may not invite guests for holding a tournament without first obtaining permission from the Golf Chairman of the Board of Directors.
14.20 The Senior Estates Golf and Country Club allows reciprocal play with other private golf clubs whereby members of those private clubs may play at Senior Estates with permission of the Golf Professional and payment of green fees.

Treasurer's Report - Treasurer Chuck Johnson: Director Johnson was absent and Director Bourne presented the following report for him: (1) The balances reported today were reconciled with bank statements and balance sheets provided by The Estates bookkeeper as of March 31, 2014. Our Operating Account balance as of March 31, 2014, was $\$ 692,960.30$. Our Reserve Account balance as of March 31, 2014, was $\$ 810,480.38$. The Accounts Receivable statistics listed herein were determined as of April 11, 2014. The balance of our Accounts Receivable was $\$ 84,255.41$. (2) Delinquent accounts totaled 84 which represents a $5.6 \%$ delinquency rate. We have 17 liens filed against properties with delinquent accounts. There are 11 delinquent properties in foreclosure. Our attorneys are working on 24 delinquent accounts in an effort to collect money owed on said accounts. Director Bourne reminded the Board that the account balances look good but we need to remember that there are still 9 months

General Manager's Report Sharon Schaub: (1) Last week I attended a meeting with Mayor Kathy Figley, Police Chief Scott Russell and City Administrator Scott Derickson to talk about how The Estates can improve security and how the City can better collaborate with residents in an effort to prevent crimes, like the recent graffiti and vandalism sprees. As City Administrator Derickson stated, "These quality of life crimes may seem minor to some, but they have a huge impact on their victims not only in terms of monetary impacts, but a sense of security in their own homes." Chief Russell will appoint a detective to accompany Tim O'Larey, Golf Chairman, and me to help determine placement of signs and surveillance cameras. A second meeting, date to be confirmed, will be scheduled with Chief Russell, Mayor Figley, Administrator Derickson to report progress. (2) Schwindt \& Co Certified Public Accountants visited The Estates last week to conduct our yearly on-site audit. David Schwindt will present the results of the audit at an upcoming board meeting. (3) The Estates received a receipt from Woodburn Food Bank stating our $\$ 713$ in food donations helped to reduce hunger in the Woodburn area in 2013. (4) Due to the recent vulnerability called HeartBleed, which has affected over millions of people's usernames and passwords, Multop Computer Solutions required us to change our passwords by April 20, 2014 on all our email accounts. (5) Maintenance - The alternator, bearing and flywheel bearings on the Free Motion Stepper and the sensors on the Precor Stepper have been adjusted and repaired. The concrete floor of the gazebo and the rafters were pressure washed, along with the sidewalk to the gazebo and the cabinets were painted. NW Natural Gas cleaned and adjusted the burners for the griddles, all in preparation for the Pancake Breakfast this Saturday.
