

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

OGA - Nancy Littlemore: Correspondence relating to the upcoming Oregon Golf Association Annual Meeting to be held Monday, October 26, 2015, at Columbia Edgewater Country Club, Portland, OR. Directors are asked to review this material carefully and be prepared to discuss and vote your club’s position at the meeting. Agenda includes: Nomination of Officers; Ratification of Executive Committee Actions; Minutes of 2014 Annual Meeting and Executive Committee Meetings; 2016 Dues Proposal; and Annual Award Nomination Ballot. A proposal to increase OGA dues by \$2 for 2016 (from \$33 to \$35) is being made by the OGA Executive Committee to be approved by OGA Directors at the Annual Meeting in October. Recognizing that while the organization has been a good steward of membership resources by controlling expenses where it can, the increase is proposed primarily for three reasons. (1) To dedicate specific resources towards establishing and conducting a membership campaign designed to improve outreach and assist clubs at growing their memberships, as well as for additional initiatives laid out in the OAG Strategic Plan. (2) To cover rising costs of business operations the past two years such as technology upgrades and individual facility fees the OGA pays to courses/clubs for hosting seminars, annual meetings and tournaments (room Rentals, food & beverage charges as well as golf greens fees for certain events). (3) To assist the OGA in attracting and retaining high quality employees, noting that the costs of employee compensation and benefits continue to rise (including health care costs and minimum wages). This \$2 increase will help ensure that the OGA can continue to provide its membership the basic core services and functions while also seeking out added benefits of membership as well as being able to continue to fund other key initiatives it supports annually such as Oregon Junior Golf, the Evans Scholar Program and turf grass research at Oregon State University. In addition Nancy presented the Nomination of Special Award. (Member of the Year etc.) There was discussion about submitting Tim O’Larey for Superintendent of the year. Nancy would like notes referring to personal incidents submitted to

her to put him up for nomination. The nomination form must be submitted by September 25. Motion by Sandy Blaylock and seconded by Mickey Harrison that we nominate Tim O’Larey for “Superintendent of the Year”. Motion passed.

Membership & Books - Marge Epling: Since OGA is planning to increase their dues by \$2 per person, Marge Epling will collect this increase and will later refund it if for some reason it doesn’t happen. There is a new 18-hole member: Diane Meithof. The new count follows: 18-hole: 54; 9-hole: 49; Social: 11, Total: 114.

Social - Louise Davidson: Next month is Past President’s Luncheon. We will be having ¼ BBQ chicken, cheesy potatoes, broccoli salad and dessert. Payment of \$8 is due by Wednesday, October 16.

Handicap - Marlene Johnson & Shirley Johnson-Boysal: No Report.

Rules Committee - Susan Gsell: Absent with notice. No Report.

Mixed Tournaments - Diana Lindberg: Absent with notice. Report read by Nancy Reed. Mixed Meeting Annual Report: The mixed committee met on September 5 to review the 2015 season and to prepare the Mixed Tournament schedule for 2016 for board approval. Diana prepared the draft schedule after the meeting, and it was sent to the committee members to double-check and to Stan Hiller to put with the Men’s and Women’s Golf Schedules and the Activity Committee schedules. It is hoped that the Mixed Tournament schedule can be presented by Janice Aiken at the September 22, 2015 general board meeting for board approval. The committee members present were: Mixed Chairs, Allan and Diana Lindberg; Fred Bourne, Janice Aiken, Clint Hansen, Kim and Paula Kilgore and Sharon and Bob Price. The committee reviewed 2015. The shotgun start was a success, as was the earlier time at 8:30 a.m. A two-man game format versus a four-man game format was discussed. Some of the committee wanted to keep some of the two-man games, but it was thought that it would be good to replace the last two-man game with a four-man format. This would make 2 games with 2 players and 4 games with 4 players. The decision earlier in the year to have a challenging game, per the Men’s Club, with 9 drives each will go away. Estates Women’s Golf General Meeting (cont.)

Golf Committee Report: Read by Janice Aiken: Meeting called to order by Janice Aiken, Golf Chair at 11:00 a.m. Reports: **Tim O’Larey, Golf Course Superintendent** (1) Aerifying the back nine, week of September 14 and the front nine, week of September 21. Using solid 1/4” tines on greens, 5/8” tines on tees and approaches. (2) Stumps were ground and the material removed. The holes were filled with dirt and topped off with sand and seed. (3) Trees on my list to be removed this fall/winter. Dead pine on right side of 3 fairway; Sweet gum left side of 16 fairway; Declining pine behind 16 green; Poplar left side property line 10, Homeowner request, I agree with the reasons; Declining poplar left side property line 6 in group of four; Other trees in question? (4) Summer help is gone. Down to off-season crew of 5, including myself. **Chuck Siver, Golf Pro** (1) There is no incentive for Members to purchase the Punch Card. The 2015 price for the card is \$200. The Golf Committee feels the price should be reduced to \$180 and the card should state Members Only. (2) Nine-Hole Member Fee (regular play) is \$17. This was an error that was not corrected in 2014 and carried over to 2015. When compared to the eighteen-hole Member fee of \$20, the nine-hole fee of \$17 is too high. The Golf Committee feels that this fee should be changed to \$15 for nine holes with an additional fee of \$5 if 18 holes are to be played. **Unfinished Business:** None. **New Business:** (1) Directional signs: A letter was received from Louise Davidson asking if it would be possible to have signage for golfers who are unfamiliar with the course, helping them locate #10 tee box, and restrooms. Fred Bourne indicated that he will be making signs for future tournaments to help with this issue. (2) Hole #4 has tree limbs encroaching on the fairway. This will be discussed at the next Golf Committee meeting. Meeting adjourned at 11:55a.m. Respectfully submitted, Janice Aiken, Golf Chair.

Chuck and Jim have also explored all options and my recommendations for right now with winter coming on, is to leave the ordering to Chuck and Jim. When I head south for the winter, I hope to explore other potential solutions. Thank you for your support and there are no easy answers.

The Draft Minutes of the September 3, 2015 Woodburn Estates & Golf Special Board of Directors Meeting was approved at the Board Meeting of September 22, 2015, however, a correction had been made by the BOD, adding pertinent information to the motion in the second to last paragraph. The BOD, having the revised version, approved the Special meeting as revised, but the *News & Views* had not received the revised version so the original draft minutes were published as being approved but without the change. The complete revised and approved minutes are printed in its entirety as follows. The addition to the paragraph is shown in underlined italics. We regret the error. – Ed.

Vice President David Bunnell called the Meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. in the Dining Hall, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. It should be noted that the posting of the notice of the Special Meeting had occurred pursuant to ORS 94.640 (10)(a). A quorum was established with all Directors present with the exception of Director Jim Taylor who was absent with notice.

The Agenda had previously been posted that identified the purpose of the Special Meeting. The Special Meeting was called as a work session to establish protocol relative to a petition to recall four Directors, said petition circulated and filed with the Board by a group of members using the name “beAboveboard”, specifically Pat Burt, Connie Lum, Pat Petersen, Linda Moro, Sharon Schaub, Kristi St.Amant, Jim Cox, Charles Blake, and Bob Day.

VP Bunnell gave opening remarks relative to the purpose and format of the Meeting. He then read a letter from the Association’s legal counsel, Kyle Grant, Vial Fotheringham LLP. Attorney Grant gave his legal opinion that the petition for the recall of the Directors is valid and that a removal meeting should be called. He then discussed the petition and the vote required for removal. The current Articles of Incorporation, Section 4.10, states that once a petition is filed and validated, removal of a Director would require ...”a majority of the total votes of the Association, not just a majority of those at a meeting”...Attorney Grant then concluded his letter by presenting three options for the Board to consider as follows: 1) Allow the vote to take place now following Section 4.10 of the Articles. This would require a majority vote of all owners in the community. 2) Allow the vote to take place now following ORS 94.640 (6) wherein only a majority of owners present at a meeting would be needed to remove the Directors. 3) Propose to the owners to postpone the vote on removal of the Directors until the current document amendment project is voted on and the documents are recorded. Under the new documents, the vote required to remove a Director would be 75 percent of the owners present at a Meeting.

VP Bunnell then opened the floor to the Directors to voice their opinion as to the three options as presented by Attorney Grant. Director Chuck Johnson voiced his opinion that the current rule of law is based on the present Articles of Incorporation,

Section 4.10, which requires the majority vote of all owners in good standing in the community to remove a Director. Option 2 in his opinion was not a valid option as it would preempt the current removal requirement as found in Section 4.10 of the Articles. Directors Janice Aiken and Stan Hiller concurred that Option 2 was not a valid option under the current Articles. The other Directors present also expressed this same opinion.

VP Bunnell then opened the floor to the members present. Twenty-two members spoke regarding the issue of the recall petition and the options presented by the attorney. Several members representing the beAboveboard group spoke, encouraging the use of Option 2 which would allow the scheduling of a recall meeting and a majority vote of those owners present to remove a Director. Other members present wanted to discuss other issues as to why GM Sharon Schaub’s contract was not renewed by the Board and the reasons for the petition to recall Directors. VP Bunnell informed these members that the purpose of the Special Meeting was to specifically discuss relevant issues related to the recall petition and the recommendations and options as presented by legal counsel.

Several members spoke or inquired as to the voting process, the length of time involved to verify the vote, the right of Directors to defend themselves as the Recall Meeting, and other related issues.

When the Board remained adamant that Option 2 was not a valid option to follow, several of the representatives of the beAboveboard group voiced their opinion that Option 3 should be followed. They agreed that the Recall Meeting to remove the specified Directors should be postponed until the current document amendment project was approved and the documents recorded.

VP Bunnell then made a motion that the Board approve Option 3 as presented by legal counsel. *Before the vote on the motion was taken, discussion ensued relative to allowing absentee ballots to be taken by members in good standing relative to the vote at the Recall Special Meeting. Director Janice Aiken specifically stated that the Board should allow absentee ballots at the Recall Meeting in addition to the vote taken of those members in good standing present at the Meeting. VP Bunnell and the other Directors agreed that absentee ballots would be allowed in the recall vote. Following this discussion, the motion to approve Option 3* was seconded by Director Larry Jones, the motion *then* passed unanimously.

Director Stan Hiller then made a motion that the Special Meeting be adjourned, motion seconded by Director Larry Jones, motion passed unanimously and the Special Meeting was adjourned at 3:20 p.m.


