


Bread Classes



Woodburn Estates & Golf – Men's Golf Club Monthly Meeting

April 5, 2023 • 10:00AM in the WEG Dining Room

The Men's Golf Club of Woodburn Estates & Golf met for its monthly meeting on April 5, 2023 at 10:00AM in the WEG Dining Room.

President Fred Bourne CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER at 10:03AM, followed by the PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. All officers and committee chairmen/representatives were present unless otherwise noted. There were 26 members in attendance.

NEW MEMBER: Steve Garner introduced himself.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- Fred Bourne requested that the Men's Club contribute \$200 from the 50-50 fund for the Master's Week tournaments (18-hole individual play on Thursday, 18-hole par 3 tournament on Friday [\$50 KP on hole 14], and 18-hole individual play on Saturday combined with a golfer's final round score at the Master's Tournament, followed by pizza in the golf lounge afterwards). The motion passed unanimously.
- It was recommended that when a KP prize is not won during tournament play, that the money pool carry over to the next week's tournament. Len Westphal opposed the recommendation and that the KP money pot for that week be paid out to the other KP hole winner. A vote was called for and the opposing recommendation failed.
- Marty Smith reminded members that scorecards must have the golfers' last name and initial of their first name clearly printed each week. All four golfers must sign the scorecards as well.
- Information for the Snowbirds Tournament is available in the golf lounge. **VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT:** No report by Mike Archer.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer Dean Cullison reported balances as of March 31:

- Checking account fund balance: \$4,061.04 (includes \$622.00 in 50-50 funds) (Note: \$3,920 payment to the OGA was made this past month)
- Voucher account balance: \$4,455.11 (a corrected beginning balance of \$4,234.90 was reported)
- The Treasurer reported 117 current members.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Steve Kufeldt reported that he represented the Men's Golf Club at the recent "New Member Welcome" event.

GREENS COMMITTEE REPORT: Ken Bourne reported due to inclement weather, planned maintenance is behind schedule, plus the grounds crew lost another employee.

HANDICAP COMMITTEE REPORT: Steve Krieg reported:

- Written instructions for the Golf Genius program have been completed, which will help future members learn the basics of this important scoring program.
- The Handicapping Policy and Procedure document has been completed and now posted in the golf lounge.
- The handicapping office has been organized and technical upgrades have been identified. Steve Krieg moved (second by Len Westphal) to approve an expenditure of up to \$700 to complete the needed technical upgrades. The motion passed unanimously.

- A question about the printing of new scorecards was raised. It was reported that we are contractually obligated for a couple more years to the current printing company. Any changes to the cards (yardage, etc.), however, are the club's responsibility.
- Stephen Hobson was thanked for his faithful volunteering to administer the 50-50 drawing each month.
- The "Golf Genius" team was also thanked for the many hours they put into scoring our weekly tournaments and play.

50-50 RAFFLE: A total of \$72 in tickets were sold and Gary Vogue won the pot (\$36).

It was duly moved and seconded to ADJOURN the meeting at 10:45AM. The NEXT MEETING of the Men's Golf Club will be Wednesday, May 3 at 10:00AM.

SUNDOWNERS GOLF @ Woodburn Estates & Golf

Sundowners is a group of golfers of all skill levels who gather together Monday evenings to play a 9-hole scramble. The season starts in May and runs through October. We meet in front of the Pro Shop between 3:15 and 3:30 to sign in and form 4 person teams. The cost is only \$5 for the entire season! (Greens fees apply to non-members) All are welcome.

- Scramble format from the Red Tees for all players.
- After the team hits all four shots per lie, the team determines which ball position will be used for the next shot. Place a marker or tee next to the chosen ball and then all players hit from that spot. The ball can be moved within 2 feet of the marker but cannot better the lie (cannot be moved closer to the hole and cannot change conditions from rough to fairway).
- One drive from each player must be used.
- If there are only 3 in a group, teams still have 4 shots from each lie. Player A will have two shots per lie from tee to hole out, then the next hole Player B will have the extra shot and so on.
- Clearly PRINT each player's name on scorecard. 1 person keeps team score to turn in at the end. Each scorecard must be dated and signed by at least 2 team members.
- Call Pro Shop at 503.981.0189 if weather does not look like it will allow for play.

Al's Spring Garden Tips

April can have unpredictable weather patterns in the Pacific Northwest. Mostly rainy days with breaks of sun. Cooler temperatures and sometimes even ice and snow have made appearances in early spring. Gardening can be a challenge, but you can still get your hands dirty. Planning and preparation for a beautiful show of blooms and bountiful edibles are in order this month.

- 1. Fertilize your lawn. Allow the early spring rain to carry the fertilizer into the soil.
- 2. Bait for slugs. Apply slug bait around newly planted flowers and emerging perennials. Clean the areas that harbor debris and make good hiding places for slugs, sowbugs, and millipedes.
- 3. Prepare the garden soil for spring planting. Incorporate organic material and other amendments as needed.
- 4. Prune and shape spring-blooming shrubs and trees after the blossoms have faded.
- 5. Cut and remove weeds near the garden areas to decrease the risk of plant disease.
- 6. Plant summer-blooming bulbs like gladiolus, lilies, and begonias..... as long as weather permits.
- 7. Cover transplants to protect against late spring frosts.
- 8. Start planting your vegetable garden. Plant cabbage, lettuce, broccoli, and other cold crop vegetables. It is also the perfect time to plant strawberries.



Alternative outdoor gardening planning can include implementing raised beds if you don't have the space in your yard. Container gardening for herbs, pretty perennials and annuals can scratch the gardening itch. Indoor gardening is always in season. Houseplants come out of their dormant stage and could use a transplant.
