




This has been an interesting time since our last Board Meeting. We had a uptick of Covid earlier this month with 1-2 dozen members affected. I got it and was down for two weeks. Everything seems to be good now with no new cases. I missed several meetings or was present via the phone. I would like to thank the Board and Management staff for moving forward for the betterment of the community. I continue to meet with Management on a weekly basis and the different committees when asked.

ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE – VP Sharyn Cornett

We met on Aug 17 discussed pancake breakfast for Sept 20, 2023, pre-sale tickets available at coffee hour- bingo and pro shop.

We have purchased 2 large new coffee makers for the kitchen to replace very old and unreliable ones.

HOUSE COMMITTEE – Director Marilyn Sbardellati

I was one of the unfortunate members to come down with Covid. Consequently, the House meeting was rescheduled for this coming Thursday the 24th of August.

I want to give a special thanks to Ron McKillip for all his hard work maintaining our grounds and to Larry Johnson for the extra hours worked and tasks taken on.

CJ Hansen completed the HVAC replacement and was called out again when the craft room unit ceased operation. Luckily, this unit was repairable. The ice machine in the restaurant needed to be replaced. A motion will be made for reserve funding of this replacement when the final cost comes in, estimated to be \$3,500.

Sharyn Cornet shared her ideas for a living room remodel, to be paid for from Activities money collected. She asked to make a presentation of her plan to the House Committee this Thursday.

Integrated Solutions changed out the card reader at the RV lot entrance gate. Pacific NW Fire Protection will be completing the upgrades to our system within a few weeks. We have only the compressor to address and our system will be good for now. We will require annual inspections going forward.

The master Cart Barn door recently broke. It will either need to be fixed or replaced.

The computers operating the irrigation system were serviced.

THE POOL COMMITTEE

The Pool Committee met. The Committee discussed timing to begin the leak detection/plumbing investigation work. This work will require intermittent pool closures once work begins. The Committee decided the best time to do this would be some time after Labor Day. This investigation is an essential first step as it will inform us of the condition and actual layout of the pool's plumbing system. The work will potentially stop the loss of nearly 1,200 gallons of water per week and will inform us better as to the scope of the necessary plumbing repairs.

The day after the Committee met, the pool heater broke and then the smaller back up heater broke. Both units are on the Reserve list for replacement next year or the year after. I was informed our new pool equipment supplier, Emerald Pools, has a heater available. We will make every attempt to get the new heater operating as quickly as possible. We hope to know more by the end of the week. We are keeping the pool open for as long as the water remains at a comfortable temperature. The temperature is currently about 85 degrees. If the weather stays warm the pool should be able to stay open through Labor Day. We will provide information on local alternative pools for members to use while the plumbing work is being conducted.

MARKETING/PC COMMITTEE – Director Sherman Lackey

The marketing PC Committee met August 8, 2023, at 1:00 PM And made the following decisions:

- Develop an ad policy that addresses non-profits organizations outside of WEG that wish to advertise in the News & Views. Sherman to create, work in progress.
- Develop a forum testing plan. Right now, the forum is active in the members area of the website.
- New areas created in the members area. Sherman to write an article in the News & Views
- Claudia Wicks requested to be added to the Committee Motion created. **NEW MEMBERS** Director Marilyn Plowman

The New Member Committee met twice this month. After many date changes we have finally set a date for the next new member welcome event. The event will be on Sunday, October 13th, at 3:00 PM in the dining room. We are planning some "Get-to-know-you" games, refreshments, and a tour of the facilities. The Rules Committee has added two new people to our ranks which should help us catch up on a backlog of complaints. Genny Heidi and Andrew Nordby have agreed to make their services available as committee members to our association.

We have revamped our letters of notification and enforcement. We would like the courtesy of your patience as we work through our cases.

In addition to complaints, we have some motions for approval. We feel these will address situations that are not specifically codified in our governing documents. There will be more to come in future meetings. We are also dealing with some long-term problems and hope to bring those to a close soon.

The Budget Committee met 2 times, August 8 and 18, to work on our 2024 budget. Members Mike Hepburn, Connie Watt, Allan Lindberg, Phil Balogh and staff Debbie Brown and Vince Cantwell present.

July\$77,895 \$143,921 (\$66,025) YTD\$648,534 \$562,858 \$86,676

July's Profit and Loss was off due to Revenue. We expected this as we have seen earlier payments in May and June by members who pay bi-annually, but we also still have \$120,000 in accounts receivable that we expect to collect most of by year end. Year-to-date our total revenues are \$11,195 better than budget.

Expenses were under budget by \$19,173 in July and are \$76,392 under budget year-to-date.

Most of this due to the fact that Labor Costs are \$89,329 under budget.

We Project our positive budget results to continue through year end.

We have reviewed initial drafts and the 2024 budget and hope to have a budget to present to the board in September.
