RECALL QUESTIONS

The N&V staff have received several questions about the Recall Election and the Special Members' Meeting. We are printing the most asked and most pertinent with what we believe to be the correct answers.

What Is The Special Meeting And Recall About?

A group of members were dissatisfied with some of the decisions of the Board of Directors and presented the Board with a petition of No Confidence several months ago. In their petition, they listed several items that they asked the Board to address. In their opinion, most of the Board failed to address their concerns and so they gathered over 300 signatures on petitions to recall four Board members—three members' terms expire at the end of 2023 so they weren't included and two directors were excluded because it was thought that those two directors did address the items falling within their purview.

Woodburn Estates & Golf Men’s Golf Club Monthly Meeting

September 6, 2023

The Men’s Golf Club of Woodburn Estates & Golf met for its monthly meeting on September 6, 2023 at 10:00AM in the WEG Dining Room.

President Fred Bourne CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER at 10:00AM, followed by the PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. All officers and committee chairmen/representatives were present unless otherwise noted. There were 14 members in attendance.

PRESIDENT’S REPORT: Fred Bourne distributed the updated “Local Rules” handout dealing with local golf rules, both permanent and temporary. It was duly moved (Steve Kreig) and seconded (Fred Bourne) to accept the updated rules. The motion passed unanimously.

Fred gave updates on the recent tournaments played since our last meeting (see separate article in the “News & Views” newspaper for full report). The Turkey Shoot will be held next week, September 14, as part of our weekly Men’s Golf League action.

VICE-PRESIDENT’S REPORT: Mike Archer shared the news that Mark Deller passed away recently.

TREASURER’S REPORT: Treasurer Dean Cullison was not present. No report.

SECRETARY’S REPORT: No report by Steve Kufeldt.

GREENS COMMITTEE REPORT: No report by Ken Bourne.

HANDICAP COMMITTEE REPORT: Marty Smith was not present. No report.

MIXED TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE REPORT: Fred Bourne reported on a successful season.

RULES COMMITTEE REPORT: Dave

Schuur reported on a couple of rules:

- The USGA Rules of Golf is a helpful app for rules and includes videos. It is highly recommended.
- Rule 6.5: Dave described a scenario on a par four where the second shot appears to go beyond the green, but the ball is out of sight. After searching for the ball, it is considered lost and then the player returns to hit again with a stroke and distance penalty. When on the green, the player holes out for a five, but then discovers that the original ball is in the hole. Question: Is it an eagle or a bogey? Answer: Once a ball is holed, the hole is considered finished, so it would be an eagle.
- Rule 11.3. If a ball hits someone else’s equipment, like a club on or near the green, for example, there is no penalty, and you must play the ball as it lies.
- There was a question concerning individual play (not team competition), what happens when another player stands in the direct line of a putt (either behind or on the other side of the hole), is this simply a breach of etiquette or is it a penalty? Various opinions were shared. Dave agreed to do some research on the rule (Rule 23.8) and report back.

SUNSHINE COMMITTEE REPORT: Chuck Johnson reported earlier that he sent a card to Connie Deller.

OGA COMMITTEE REPORT: Dave Rushton reported that the annual OGA meeting is scheduled for October. He reported that a part of our annual dues goes to different contracts (such as Adidas and Nike for their “employee discount” events). Dues will increase from \$35 to \$41 to help with some of the cost increase for the Golf Genius program.

Another OGA resource is the Member Planet program, which assists clubs in various ways. The OGA also has seminars to help prepare someone to take the test required to become a “rules official.”

UNFINISHED BUSINESS / NEW BUSINESS: It was noted that money in one’s account in the Pro Shop accrues through November 30 and as previously agreed, the balance must be spent in its entirety by December 31, or the remaining balance will be forfeited. Any money won after November 30 will roll over into the next calendar year.

FOR THE GOOD OF THE ORDER: Phil Balough suggested that we change next year how we handle the gross stroke championship, as this year we only paid out one winning spot in the gross stroke competition, while we paid out multiple net scores in the different flights.

Steve Kufeldt reported that the Woodburn Area Chamber of Commerce is considering bringing back the Mayor’s Cup competition. One idea is to include the WEG course as part of the tournament. It was noted that the schedule for tournaments for the next year is to be approved by the Board in October.

50-50 RAFFLE: A total of \$30 in tickets were sold and Jimmy Carter won (\$15).

It was duly moved and seconded to ADJOURN the meeting at 10:48AM.

The NEXT MEETING of the Men’s Golf Club will be Wednesday, October 4 at 10:00AM.

Clearing Up the Confusion on Annual Meeting Date

There may be many of the members who are confused about the date and time of the Annual Members' Meeting as it has changed several times in the last few weeks.

To explain, the Election Review Committee met several times and prepared a report given to the Board of Directors. In its recommendations, the committee suggested that the annual meeting be moved to the second Saturday in November at 1:30 pm to allow for all members, retired or still working, to attend. This necessitated a bylaw change and was voted on by the Board of Directors in the June, 2023 meeting.

Then, because the second Saturday of November falls on Veterans' Day this year, it was suggested that the meeting be moved, just for this year, to the first Saturday of November. That motion was made and passed in the August meeting. So the Secretary sent a notice to the N&V to that effect, but changed the time to 10 am.

Then it was found that the auditorium had been rented for November 4 so the meeting couldn't be held that day at any time. The President of the BOD, without consulting anyone else, changed the meeting to Tuesday, November 7, which went against the bylaw change which was that the meeting be on a Saturday. This notice was sent out by Bugle Blast further confusing the issue.

Finally, the BOD called a special meeting and voted to hold the annual meeting on Sunday, November 12, at 2 pm. This will be for 2023 ONLY. All other years the annual meeting will be on the second Saturday in November at 1:30 pm.

RECALL QUESTIONS *(Continued)*

Is This Recall About The Golf Course?

No. The members behind the recall do not want to close or sell off the golf course. Our founding documents say we have to have a golf course. This vote therefore has nothing to do with the golf course.

If Those Directors Who Are Officers Get Recalled, Will They Still Be Directors?

No. The recall vote will remove them as directors and therefore, as officers as well. If an officer is recalled, the remaining Board members will vote on another director to fill the office until the new Board is elected in November. In a recall, the remaining Board members will also appoint a new director to fill out the remaining term of the recalled director.

I Still Work And Can't Attend The Meeting On A Weekday Afternoon. Can I Still Vote?

As of the print date of this paper, that has not been decided. There

will be a letter sent to all members explaining the process and it should have those specifics.

What Will Happen At This Meeting?

The four directors being recalled will have a chance to talk if they so desire. At this juncture, it is not known if the group bringing the recall petition will speak. Ballots will be handed out and voting can take place. Members can recall one, two, three or all directors or none.

Our legal documents are ambiguous about how many votes must be cast. On our annual elections, a majority of those present (and/or absentee) would be enough for the election to be valid. It could also be argued that our documents say the majority of those eligible to vote constitutes a valid election. That would mean majority of the 1,508 houses. Oregon law states that you can't make it more arduous to vote. At this printing, it is unknown what process will be used.

Please look for the letter in your mailbox which will, hopefully, explain the specifics that are going to be used in this special meeting and recall vote. Please direct any other questions or comments to the appropriate director (see BOD email addresses on page 7 in this issue).

Italy – Trying to Find My Roots *(part 1)*

My grandfather was born in Italy and immigrated to this country with his parents and siblings as a child. He didn't go to school here as he couldn't speak English (no English as a second language classes back then) so went to work in the lead mines to help support his family. Even so, he managed to return to Italy twice before he married at 25, then never returned. He made a success of himself despite his limited education and owned and ran a successful beer distributorship in the Mid-West. I was the oldest (and only for 6 years) grandchild and he was a wonderful, loving grandfather. So even though he didn't speak of his homeland very often (and was so proud of bring an American, he didn't speak Italian to his children or grandchildren), the customs, traditions and foods of my extended family were very much Italian. He died from cancer way too early. I was just 19 and most of my cousins were either too young to remember him well or hadn't born born yet. I had been dabbling in genealogy with ancestry.com and 23 and me, but had hit a wall when it came to finding records in Italy.

So when 13 of the 16 grandchildren attended my aunt's funeral in March, many of them asked me about our family. That was my impetus to finally make that trip back to where it started. My cousin Tracey and her husband Tim were planning a trip to Italy so we decided to go together for part of it to find our "roots".

We flew from Seattle to Amsterdam with a connecting flight to Turin, Italy. You don't hear much about Turin (Torino) even though it's the fourth largest city in Italy and was the first capitol of Italy when it unified in the early 1800's. The Dolomite Mountains dominate the landscape. It's on the Po River, the longest river in Italy and has many beautiful, historical buildings and monuments. There was shopping everywhere and many of them were very upscale. People dressed very stylishly and blingy (guess I get it naturally!). There are single family homes in the hills, some very lavish (we saw them from a double decker sightseeing bus). But most people live in the City in apartment buildings or above shops. Our AirB&B was in an old building that had been bombed in WWII and restored to its elegance in the 1950's with a wrought iron gate and heavy wooden door and marble entry. They added two elevators, but they were tiny and could hold only two people if you breathed in! Luckily, the apartment was air conditioned as the weather had turned very hot, in the 90's.

We had watched Stanley Tucci's "Finding Italy"on CNN and the episode about Turin had him visiting a family restaurant off the beaten track that specialized in Bagna Cauda. Since that was a favorite dish in our family for all holidays and generally, just when we were together, we got a reservation. Oftentimes, restaurants and some stores close in August so this restaurant had just reopened. After the wait and anticipation, we

were told that that was a "winter" dish and was only available November - March! It's a northern Italian dish so we couldn't expect to get it anywhere else. Ah, well!

We weren't going to chance driving in Italy (it's true—they drive a little dangerously and have roundabouts everywhere and no one seems to stop or even slow down entering them!). So we got a taxi and visited the village where our family began. It's called Vauda Canavese and it's approximately 20 miles northwest of Turin. It's considered part of metropolitan Turin, but why I don't know as we passed farmland and hills with not much in between Turin and Vauda. I was expecting houses spread out with large yards with gardens and maybe chickens! But Vauda had several small streets with two-story houses, small apartments, a pharmacy, a very small market, one restaurant, a school, a city building and an old church. All but a few houses and the church looked relatively new — at least in the last 50 years.

We started in the church because we thought we could ask the priest to see the church records—it's probably the church where our great-grandparents were married and where our grandfather was baptized. It is a beautiful church with many statues and paintings, including a mural on the domed ceiling over the altar, a la the Sistine Chapel. The municipal building was closed and wouldn't open until late afternoon. School hadn't begun yet, but there were teachers taking a break outside so I approached them and asked in my limited Italian if they knew how to contact the priest and why we were there. One of the younger teachers had some English and I did have a letter I had had translated into Italian explaining what we were doing so we found out that the priest lived in another little town as he had several small churches he was the curate. So that was a dead end at least then. The cemetery was too far to walk and there were no taxis so that was also a dead end, no pun intended. But one of the teachers remembered an older woman who was a Caresio (our family name). She called her and we were invited to her home. She was a Caresio all right, but her branch had immigrated to France. She spoke no English and her friend who was helping translate also spoke no English. Nevertheless, we managed to converse and her friend gave us the email address of the "capo" - head guy of the municipal office— so we could get records. We were also served sparkling water in Maria's best stemware.

From there, we went to the small market and bought some Toma cheese-a cheese our grandfather used to import from Italy and is almost impossible to find here. Heaven! Then we went to the only restaurant in the village (population 1450). They didn't open until 12 so we had a glass of wine and waited. The waitress (again no English) said there wasn't a menu. You got a four course meal with coffee, and water for \$12 Euros—about \$13. Wine was \$2 Euros a glass. We had so much food left that we asked for a take home box, but nothing registered with the waitress until we said "doggie bag"! There were several older men there drinking wine and coffee so I approached them, showed them pictures and asked for their assistance. They said there were many, many Caresios in Vauda, but they didn't know anyone related to us for sure. After all, it had been well over 100 years since our ancestors had left Vauda for America. Our great grandfather had siblings who stayed in Vauda so we're sure we have cousins there so I'm still going to contact the municipal offices and the priest to gather more information, but it was disappointing to find no one while we were there.
