Reports of Officers, Boards and Standing Committees

The House Committee and Pool Sub-Committee both met since the last Board Meeting.

First a big thank you to Randy Wolfer for taking it upon himself to set up the auditorium for the October 10th member's meeting, your actions were greatly appreciated by our staff.

Facilities Maintenance continues to be short staffed, limiting the amount of work and projects that can be taken on.

PNW Fire will be on site on October 27th and will be working in the vault outside the breezeway and in other spaces in the west wing. They will be completing their work and preparing for a systemwide inspection.

Facilities Maintenance discovered an issue with the duct work leading from the AC units above the restaurant. The repair work done some years ago was not done properly and part of the duct system needs replacement. CJ Hansen will schedule a site visit and plan for the repair. CJ Hansen was successful in 'hacking' the Renzor heater servicing the health Center dressing rooms. They bypassed the 'high tech' controls and restored heat to the serviced area.

A 5-year restaurant contract was signed the morning of our last board meeting. Going forward, we are responsible for the repair and replacement of all restaurant equipment owned by the Association.

"Landlord shall replace failed Equipment with an equivalent or better make/model in new condition unless otherwise coordinated and agreed upon by the Parties."

Jim Taylor is taking on the task of monitoring the chlorine levels for our pool. He is taking the appropriate classes and testing online in order to be licensed for this. We started contacting local pool companies for on-site visits. This is the first step in the bidding process. The first visit is scheduled for November 1. In the meantime, the pool continues to be fully operational, and the water temperature is set to a soothing 90 degrees for your enjoyment.

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The Marketing committee did not meet and does not have an additional report.

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A New Member Welcome Event was held on Sunday, October 13, at 3 in the afternoon.
