RULES COMMITTEE REPORT: Dave Schuur reported on some golf rules ...

If a sprinkler head interferes with a golfer's stance or swing, no matter where you are on the course, you can take free relief.

If a golfer prefers to putt while on the apron of the green and a sprinkler head is in the way of the intended ball flight, there is no free relief. The ball must be played as it lies.

If there is water in between your ball and the green, there is no free relief. However, if you are standing in water or the ball is in casual water, you can take free relief.

When chipping on to the green and you accidentally hit another ball that is on the green, the ball that was hit must be replaced to its original location. The ball that struck the other ball, however, is played where it ends up. There is no penalty.

When putting on the green, hitting another ball is a two-stroke penalty.

One major handicap change for 2024 is that 9-hole play will now be updated with a player's handicap immediately.

Walking on the Golf Course


Be Courteous. Be Considerate. Be Respectful


The ability to walk and enjoy the natural beauty of the golf course is beyond special. However, it can be fraught with issues. For this to be successful and continue, it will be necessary for walkers and golfers to follow some common sense rules.


Complete set of Rules is available when you pick up the lanyard. Here are some important points:

 The primary use of this area is to play golf. All Golf tournaments and scheduled activities will have priority.

 The decision to open or close the course either to golfers and/or to walkers is at the discretion of Management and must be respected by all.

 Walkers must have their orange lanyards visible while walking on course.

 No recreational bikes. scooters or other wheeled devices are allowed on cart paths. Golf bikes are allowed.

 No walking nor golfing after dark.

How to obtain your Walking Lanyard

When paying your HOA fees at the office, fill out the request form for your 'Walking Lanyard'. You will receive an email when it is ready and you can go to the ProShop to sign the release form, receive a complete list of rules and your new lanyard. If you have a lanyard from last year, you need a 2024 sticker to be placed on it to be valid. Ask at the office for this sticker.

Remember

Your lanyard must be visible when walking on the cart paths of the golf course.

Jan -	Before 9 am & after 3 pm
Feb -	Before 9 am & after 3 pm
Mar -	Before 8 am & after 4 pm
Apr -	Before 8 am & after 5 pm
May -	Before 8 am & after 6 pm
Jun -	Before 8 am & after 7 pm
Jul -	Before 8 am & after 7 pm
Aug -	Before 8 am & after 7 pm
Sep -	Before 8 am & after 6 pm
Oct -	Before 9 am & after 5 pm
Nov -	Before 9 am & after 3 pm
Dec -	Before 9 am & after 3 pm

For morning and evening access, nine holes will be open to walking and 9 holes will be open to golf (if applicable). The nines shall alternate weekly with Monday being the weekly start day. This is determined by the 'Monday' of each week.

Odd Number: Walk front nine; Golf back nine

Even Number: Walk back nine; Golf front nine

will no longer be able to participate.

House Committee Report
Director Marilyn Sbardellati

The House Committee last met on November 15th. This month's meeting is scheduled for tomorrow. All pool tables were recovered at the direction of the Activities Director, Sharyn Cornett. I met with Sharyn at an earlier date and explained our committee's desire to explore repurposing this space as there are currently a small number of members using the pool tables. At that time, we agreed to recover only three of the five tables. The pool tables and a snooker table are underutilized, and we could make better use of this space as a multi purpose game room.

Sharyn Cornett indicated in her BOD report in October the desire to replace the flooring in the restaurant with luxury vinyl plank flooring, no other information was forthcoming until last week. The Committee feels there is a potential slip hazard, considering the number of spills and kitchen grease being tracked into the dining area. Any hard surface will pose a slip hazard to not only our members but to members of the public and to the restaurant staff.

LVP flooring comes with its own set of problems; country of origin, source material used and potential for mold growth, among others. Also, LVP contains polyvinyl chloride or PVC, known to be hazardous to the environment and to human health.

Over the Thanksgiving weekend we fulfilled our contracted obligation and had the carpet professionally cleaned, for the second time this year. The technician inspected the carpet and reported it to be in good condition except for the extreme soiling. This is the same person who successfully cleaned it last time. His suggestion

was to contact ChemDry, they use a different process and have excellent results. I called ChemDry and they offered to have a look at our carpet, tell us if they can, in fact, clean it, and give us an estimate of the cost.

Northside Electric changed the fluoresent lights in the conference room and helped trace the carriage lights on either side of the living room/restaurant entrance. They will now get them wired. We had to repair the exhaust fan on the pool roof, again. The sump pump in the stormwater vault near the cart washing area is not operating consistently. Vince is monitoring it and considering replacing it.

The stormwater vaults in the parking lot have been cleaned and seem to be functioning properly, even though most still need some repair. More drainage work needs to be done between the billiard room and the fitness center. Also, in the southeast corner of the swimming pool building to the city storm drain.

Christmas decorations and lights were put up around the clubhouse, thanks go to Facilities and our volunteers. The two worn love seats were removed from the living room. This made a big improvement in that space. We do not plan on putting them back.

The Pool Committee met on November 16th; our next meeting is scheduled for this Thursday. The bids from Emerald Pool were examined. They did not provide a bid for a new spa. I will contact them and inquire. We decided all plumbing work be done at the same time as work on the pool. This would necessitate a one-time pool closure.

I met and discussed the project scope with Anderson Pools, the second of three contractors bidding on the pool and spa project. We will receive their bid for the pool renovation and self-contained spa within the next week or so.

The Committee hopes to have all the required bids in and reviewed at our January meeting.

The rules committee has been busy doing and undoing verbiage changes based on the recent information and decisions made by the board this year. We will post the last changes for the year 2023 soon.

On the complaint and compliance side, the committee thanks those homeowners who, through whatever circumstances dealt with us, for their quick resolution to the issues presented to them. We have only a handful of difficult cases left to carry into the year 2024. So, well done to you all. Your careful attention to the details keeps our home values in tip-top shape.

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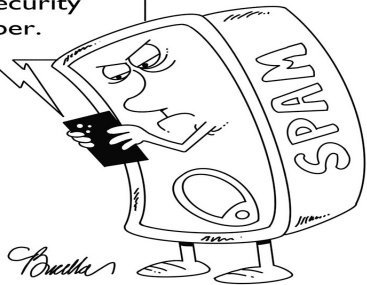
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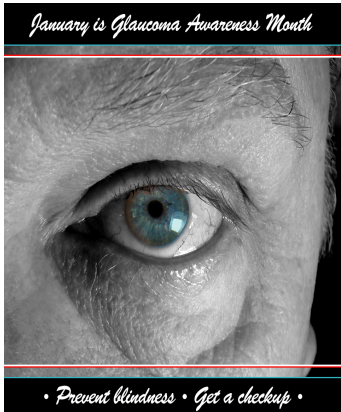
