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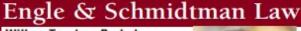

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

To obtain a lanyard.

If you have already requested one, come by the Pro Shop and pick it up. If you paid your HOA dues but did not fill out the request form, you can fill out a form at the office, or the Pro Shop.

Sign-in sheet is required for walkers as with all other areas of the HOA. This is exactly the same for use of the swimming pool, exercise room, billiards room, and the golf course. The facilities is a private club and only the paid members are allowed to use the amenities. Sign-in logs are a simple way to know the usage of each amenity. If you are passionate about a particular activity, it is to your advantage to sign-in and demonstrate that there is interest in that particular amenity and it needs to be maintained.

How to log-in to walk: There are four different options.

- 1) You can sign the log-in sheet found in the Golf Lounge.
- 2) You can call the Pro Shop and they will sign you in.
- 3) You can go to <a href="https://forms.gle/uFNYDZJ3vEoeA5S9A">https://forms.gle/uFNYDZJ3vEoeA5S9A</a> with a phone or computer and log in.
- 4) You can scan the QR code on your lanyard and go to that same page.

It doesn't matter which of these options you use. All four create a simple list of date, time, and name of people using the amenity. Please note that the information on the sign-in sheet for options 1 & 2 is available for anyone to see. One can go back and review who has used the pool and/or exercise room for the last month or see who has played golf. This sign-in sheet would be no different. However, options 3 & 4 put the information on a spreadsheet that is not public and accessible by the office staff only.

**Is there a tracker on my phone?** There is no tracker of any kind on your phone. You can use your phone to reach the internet page to log-in if you don't want to drive to the clubhouse. It is a sign-in page only.

Where to get more information? On the SEGCC webpage, there is a heading of 'Golf'. If you open that header and look for 'Walking the Course', you will find a map of the golf course and additional information.

Golf is a strange game - You yell "fore", shoot a 7 and write down a 5.

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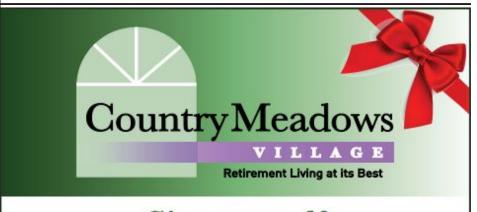
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# **ESTATES QUILTERS 2023 ANNUAL REPORT**

Recent research shows that singing with a group brings people together, improves health, confers a sense of well-being, and triggers bonding.

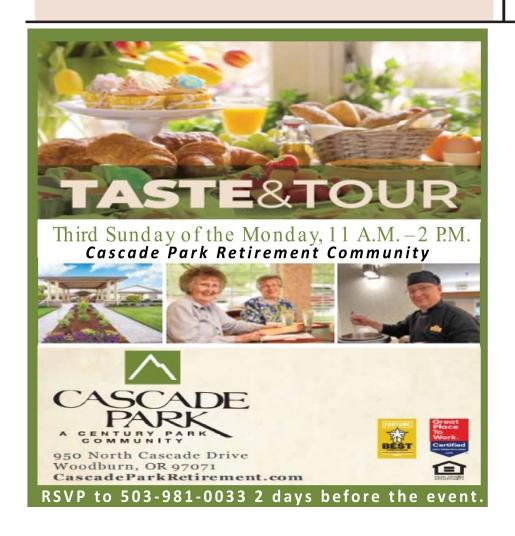
In fact, in a 2015 study at the University of Oxford, researchers found that strangers who sang with each other for an hour emerged with an unusually close bond. It's especially enjoyable for mixed groups of males and females, since their voices are on average an octave apart.

Researchers have found health benefits too. Singing together reduces heart rate, blood pressure and stress hormones. Some early studies have found that singing may also improve lung health.

## Artist of the Month for February 2024

# Sharon Caulkins





Perhaps the most gifted, natural artist I've encountered is Sharon Caulkins of Milwaukie, Oregon.

A self-described "tomboy" growing up, Caulkins also possessed a feminine side. She fished, hunted and attended Beauty College in her teens. Once she graduated and went to work in a salon, she decided she hated it and opted for outdoor work instead. Ultimately she made her living on horseback, teaching others to ride. All the while, she created art, experimenting with dozens of media from air brush to taxidermy. Subject matter tends to be nature or native American oriented. Animals

like horses, buffalo, wolves and eagles are featured prominently in her work.

What we see on exhibit today are examples of her painting on canvas but we could as easily showcase her work on porcelain (platters to bathroom sinks), buoys, cabinetry or apparel.

If there is such a thing as a born artist, Sharon Caulkins is the real deal.
