# How St. Patrick's Day Became Global

The story of how St. Patrick's Day became a global celebration is as curious as how Patrick himself became Ireland's foremost saint.

The man who would become St. Patrick was a 5th century Roman-British Christian missionary. What



we know about him comes from a single literary source called the Declaration, written by Patrick himself. In it, Patrick talks about being kidnapped by Irish raiders who enslaved him on Gaelic Ireland. He explains that he found God during his 6 years as a slave. According to Patrick, God guided him to the coast where a ship was waiting to take him home.

Once home, he studied to become a priest and returned to Ireland where he converted thousands of pagans to Christianity. Patrick died on the 17th March 461 AD and this date became an official Christian feast day called St. Patrick's Day in the early 1600s.

Today, St. Patrick's Day is now commemorated globally. There are celebrations as far as New Zealand, Argentina, and Tokyo as well as closer to home in places like New Orleans and Louisiana. Experts say that while this has been partly influenced by the migration of the Irish around the world, the festival also exists in places where there aren't many ethnic Irish people and is celebrated in more countries than any other national festival.

There is nothing really Irish about the celebrations worldwide. In Tokyo festivities focus on cultural exchange. In Montreal, where St. Patrick Day parades began when Irish soldiers in the British army observed the day.





# LOVE BOAT CRUISE - Adventures of Lorrie Cox, Kathy Tatro and Alice Tvetan

Back in the late 70's and 80's watching the Love Boat series on TV, it never entered my mind that someday I'd take a cruise on the Love Boat. Of course it's not the same smaller ship used in filming the original series. It's now one of the larger ships built by Princess and was used to film the reunion show in the late 90's, thus the name. When the original series aired, only about 500,000 people per year cruised. The show literally transformed the cruise industry and now millions of people take cruises every year.

On the 4th of Februay, six friends set sail from Galveston Texas, on the Regal Princess Love Boat. Three from SEGCC (Lorrie Cox, Kathy Tatro and Alice Tvetan), plus Alice's daughter and two other friends. As we departed the port, we heard the ship's horns play the first several notes from the Love Boat theme song. It turned out this theme sounded each time we departed a port, and also at noon each day. And we started to listen for this whimsical feature of our cruise.

Our first port, Cozumel, Mexico, had to be aborted due to rough seas. Our captain tried to dock, but after about 20 minutes decided it wasn't a safe maneuver. A Carnival ship ahead of us also gave up. Prior to this, waves were hitting the windows on deck 5. Thankfully our ship had state of the art stabilizers so we only felt some gentle rocking and none in our group got seasick. This gave us an extra sea day in which to enjoy the many activities and entertainment on board, plus soaking up the sun. Our Oregon bodies craved this dose of Vitamin D.

Our next stop was Belize. However we had some excitement a few hours prior. We were awakened at about 4:00am to the Captain announcing Man Overboard several times. What a shock!! Could someone have possibly fallen off our ship?? We rushed to our adjoining balconies and watched the rescue unfold. We watched a searchlight scan the seas and then lock on what appeared to be a very small boat. A rescue boat fast approached, stayed in place for quite a time, then sped off. The Captain then announced two people were rescued and were now safe. Whew, what a relief!! That evening we learned two young men were sleeping in their small boat and got caught in the ship's wake. This tossed them out of their boat and into the water. This was observed from the Bridge and our Captain immediately initiated international protocol for the closest ship to respond to man overboard incidents. boats for the 20 minute ride into Belize City. We scheduled an excursion for a river cruise to see various wildlife including manatees, crocodiles, iguanas, storks and monkeys. Then we boarded a bus to spend some time at the Mayan ruins.

Our next stop was Roatan, Honduras, a lush and beautiful tropical island off the mainland. We scheduled a tour that included a stop at an iguana sanctuary, where hundreds of these reptiles skittered around our feet, and not my favorite stop. to say goodbye to the sloths and head back to our ship.


